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Quality and Usability Measures

Items 4 - 9 are the criteria that tell us whether, in your judgment, the resource suggests an effective teaching strategy. A resource must garner at least one "A" and no "C's" in this group of items, to be considered a candidate for "Best" or "Promising" practice. If the resource does not meet these minimal quality and usability criteria, it will not be selected for the OSSRC Web Site.

A resource must receive all "A's" and "B's" to be considered for Best Practice.

A rating of "C" on one of these items will enable the resource to be considered a Promising Practice.

A rating of "C" on two or more items will eliminate the resource from consideration for the OSSRC Web Site.
